Smith's son Jaden Smith Co-Sters, making his film debut as Gardner's son Christopher Jr. Steven Conrad's screenplay is based on the best memoir 2006 with the same name written by Gardner with Tincy Troupe. It is based on the struggle almost a year of Gardner who is homeless. While Gardner is trying to sell one of the scanners, he meets Jay Twistle, a main manager and a partner for Dean Witter Reynolds, and hits him by solving Rubik's cube during a taxi ride. After the leaves Jay, Gardner lacks money to pay the fare and chooses to run instead, making sure that the driver chases him in a Bart station. Gardner Boards a train but loses one of his scanners in the process. His new relationship with Jay earned him the opportunity to become an internal stockbroker. On the day before the interview, Gardner agrees to paint his apartment so as to delay being evicted due to his difficulty in paying rent. While painting, Gardner is welcomed by two policemen at his house, who take him to the station, stating that he has to pay for the numerous parking tickets he accumulated. HowOf the sanction, Gardner is ordered to spend the night in prison instead, complicating his program for the interview the next morning. Gardner manages to get to the Dean Witter office in time, although still in him's Shabby clothes. Despite the appearance of him, he hits the IL and lands an unpaid internship. Gardner's unpaid internship does not like Linda, who eventually leaves for New York, because she could get a job at her boyfriend's new restaurant. Afterwards, Gardner finds the bone scanner he lost in the BART station before and, after repairing, sells it to a doctor, thus completing all the sales of his scanners. Leaned from his limited hours of work, and knowing that maximizing his customers' contacts and profits is the only way to earn the broker's position, Gardner develops a number of ways to make phone sales calls more efficient, including reaching potential high-value customers, defying protocol. A nice perspective, Walter Ribbon, who is a high-level pension fund manager, also brings Gardner and his son to a San Francisco 49ers game where he is friend of some of Walter's friends who are also potential customers. Regardless of his challenges, he never reveals his low circumstances to his colleagues, even going to give one of his bosses, Mr. Frohm, five dollars for taxi, a sum that he cannot afford. Gardner also studies and assos the Stockbroker licensing exam, ensuring his future career as a professional broker. Concluding his last day of internship with Dean Witter Reynolds, he was summoned to a meeting with his partners. Mr. Frohm notes that he wears a new shirt, to which Gardner explains that it is his last day and thought it was appropriate to dress for the occasion. Mr. Frohm smiles and says he should wear another one tomorrow, letting him know that he won the long full-time position with returning him \$5 as promised. Fighting tears, Gardner shakes his hands with them, then rushes to the care of his son to embrace Christopher. They walk along the road, joking each other (and they went from the real Chris Gardner, in a business costume).
